



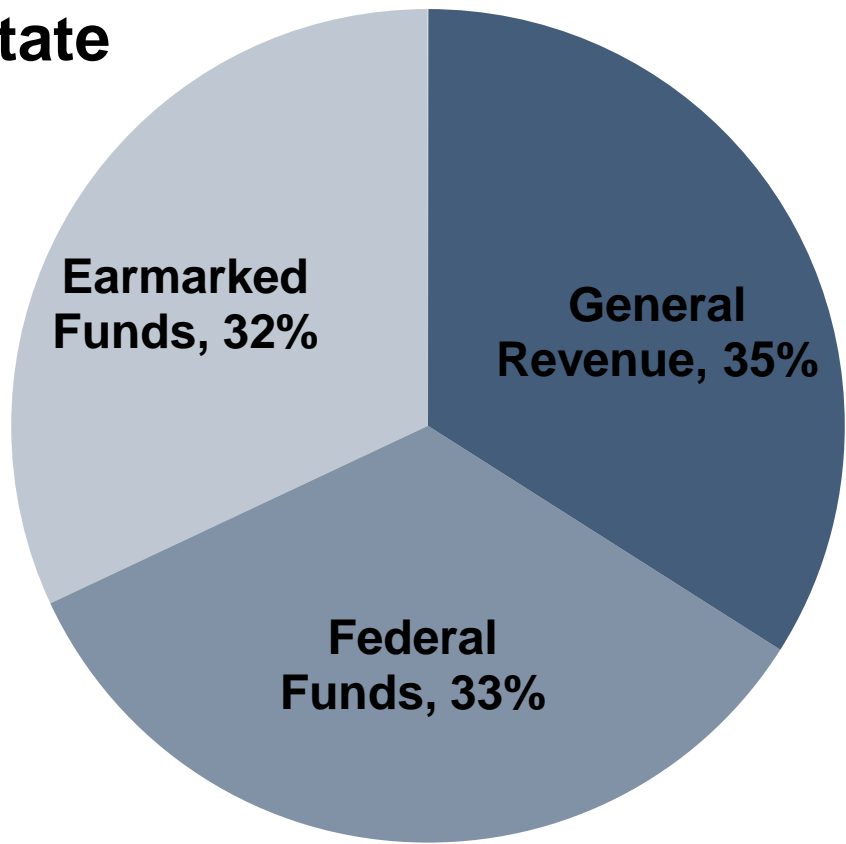

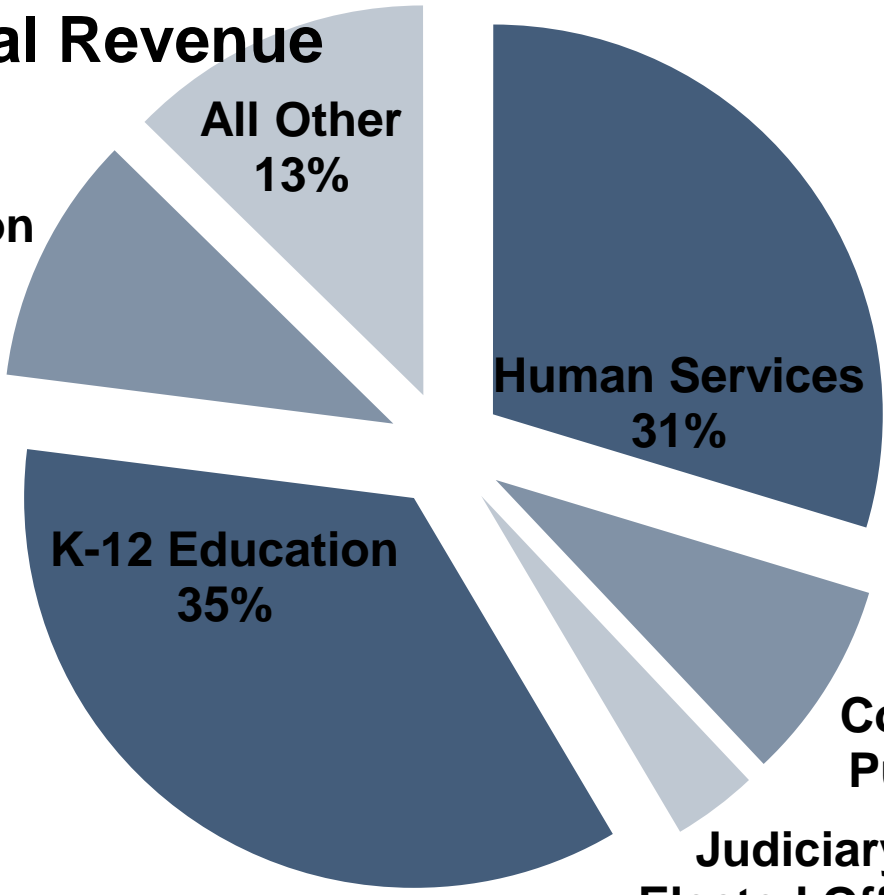

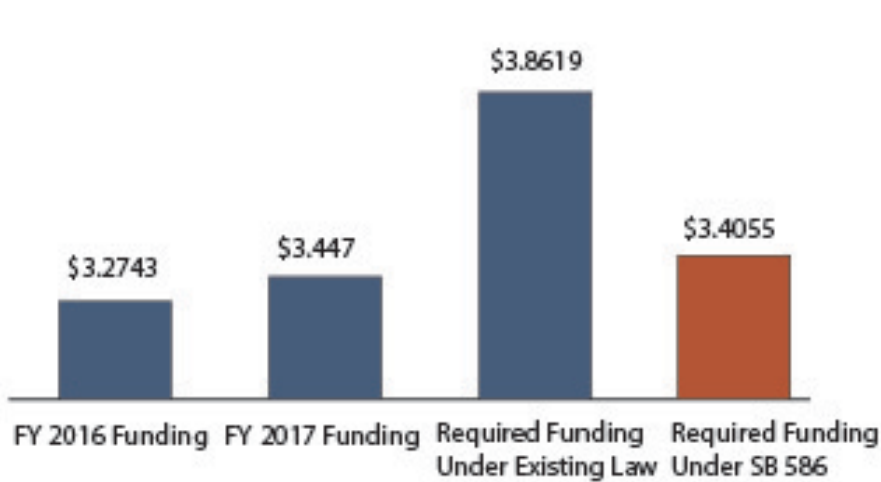
## State General Revenue Collections Among the Lowest in Decades

**GR as % of Personal Income, Fiscal Years 1981-2016**

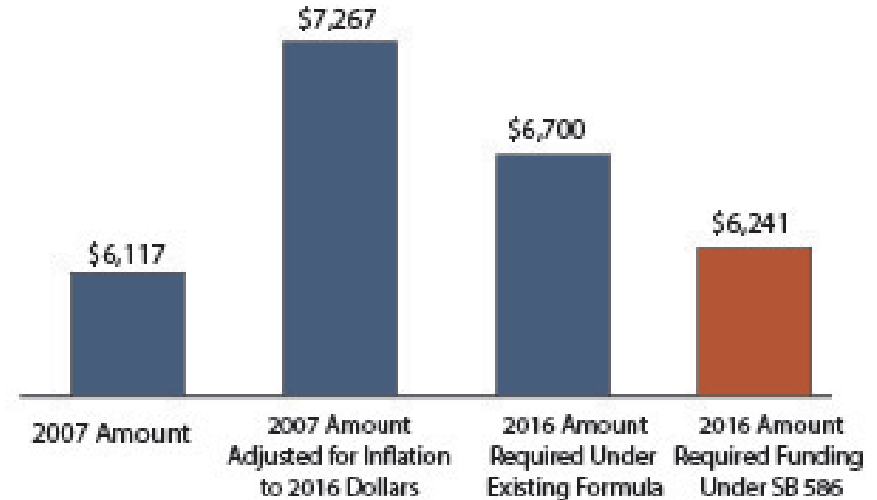




# *K-12 Funding Increases Modestly, But with Big Changes in Funding Formula*

After Reinstatement of Cap***

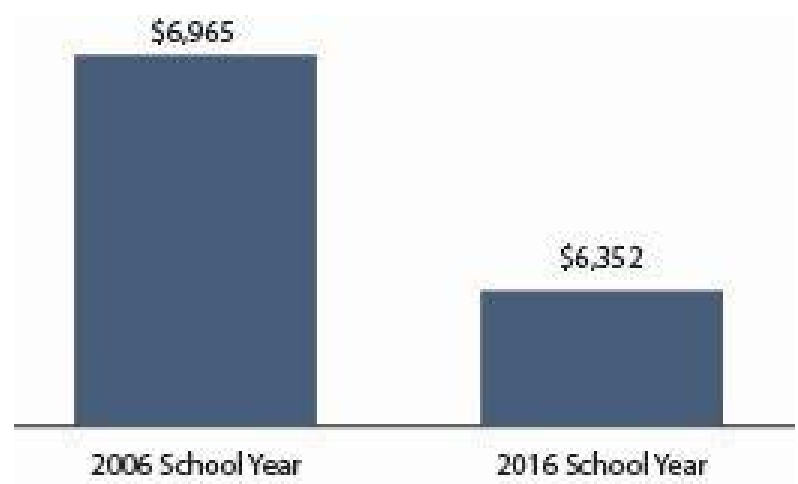


***Required Per Student Funding

# *Higher Education Funding Increased, Remains Far Below 2007 Level*

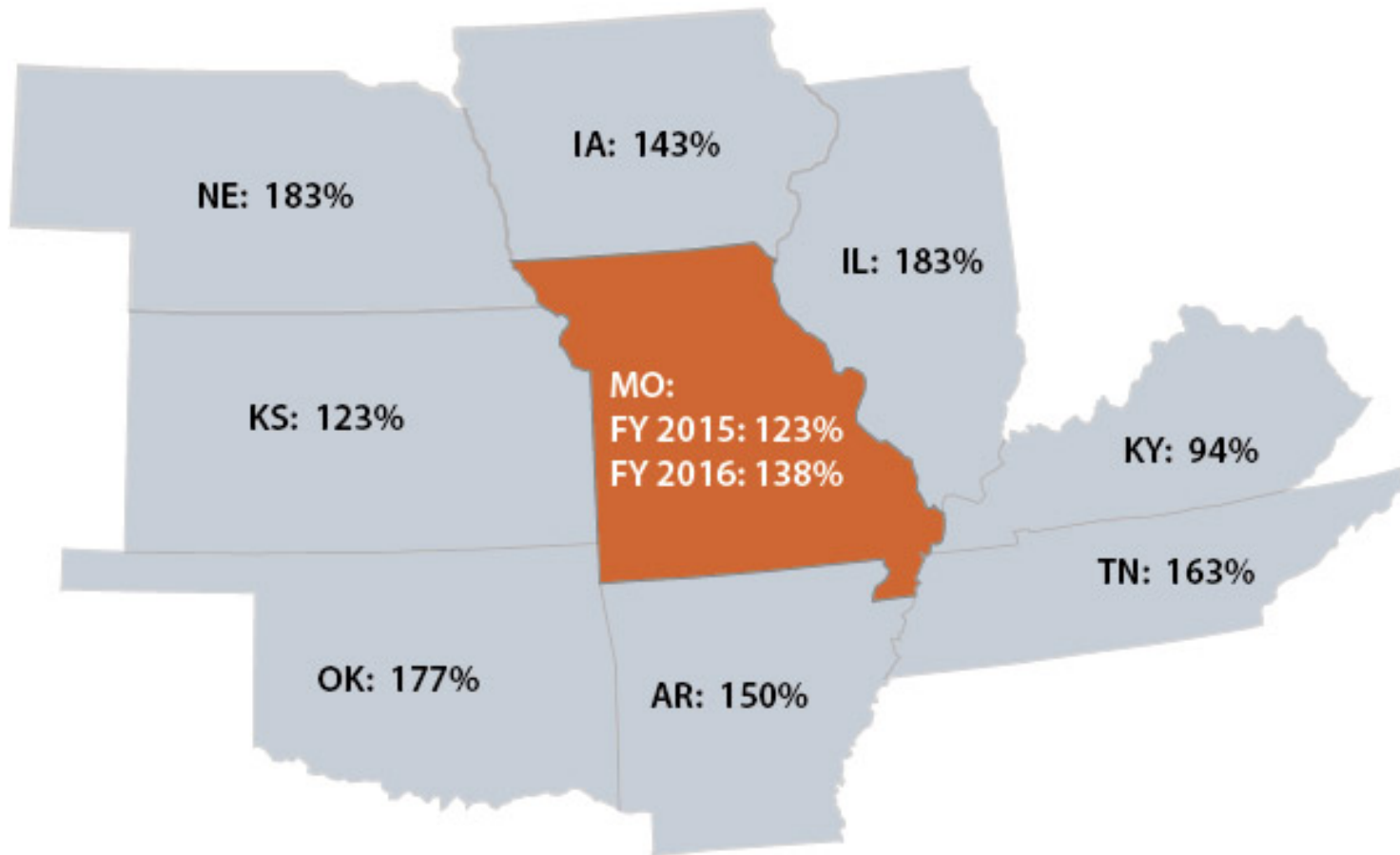
*State Funding Per College Student Has Dropped by Over

**Eligibility for Child Care Assistance in Missouri is Below the National Average of 182%, Below Most Neighboring States**

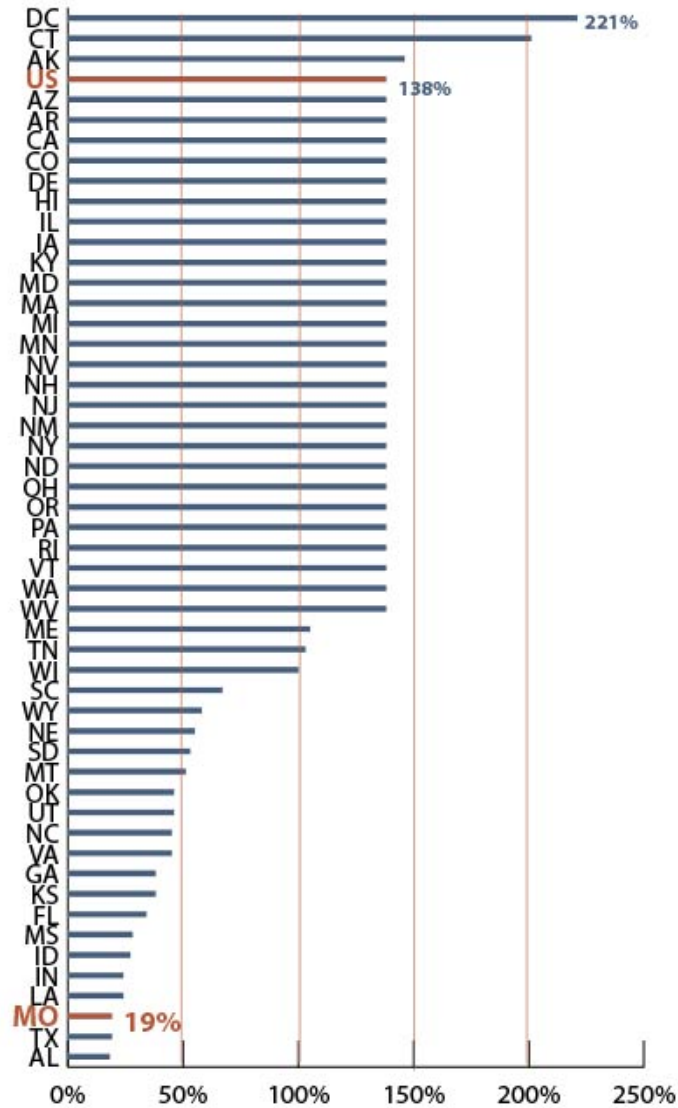


## Eligibility for Medicaid in Missouri Among Lowest in Nation

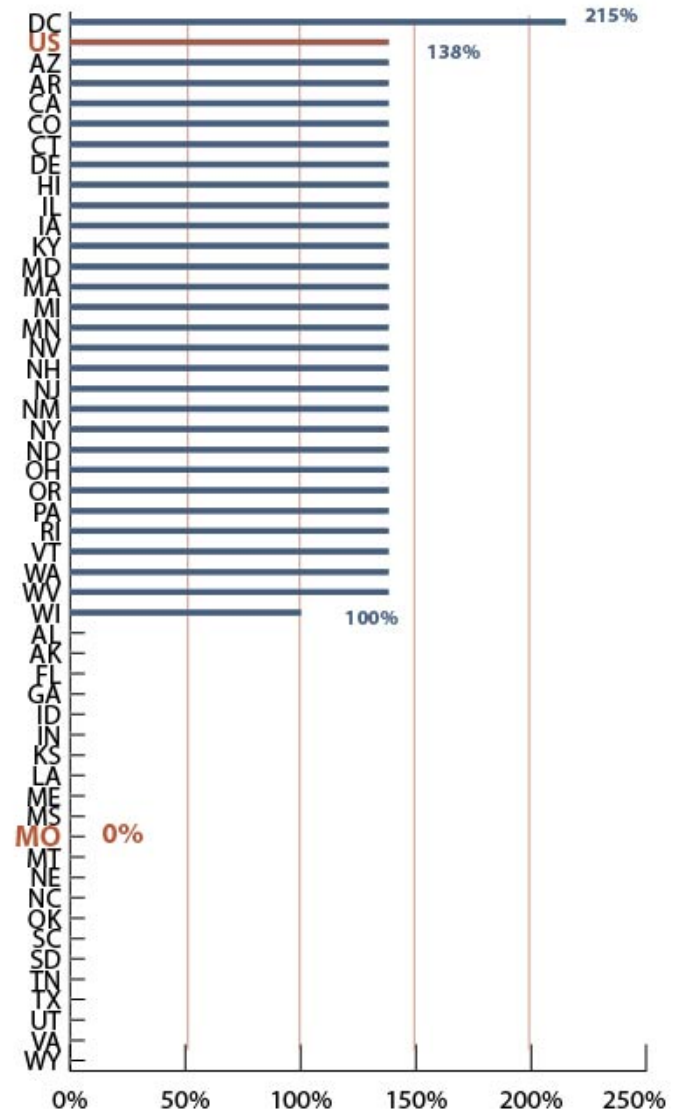
### Income Eligibility Limits for Adults

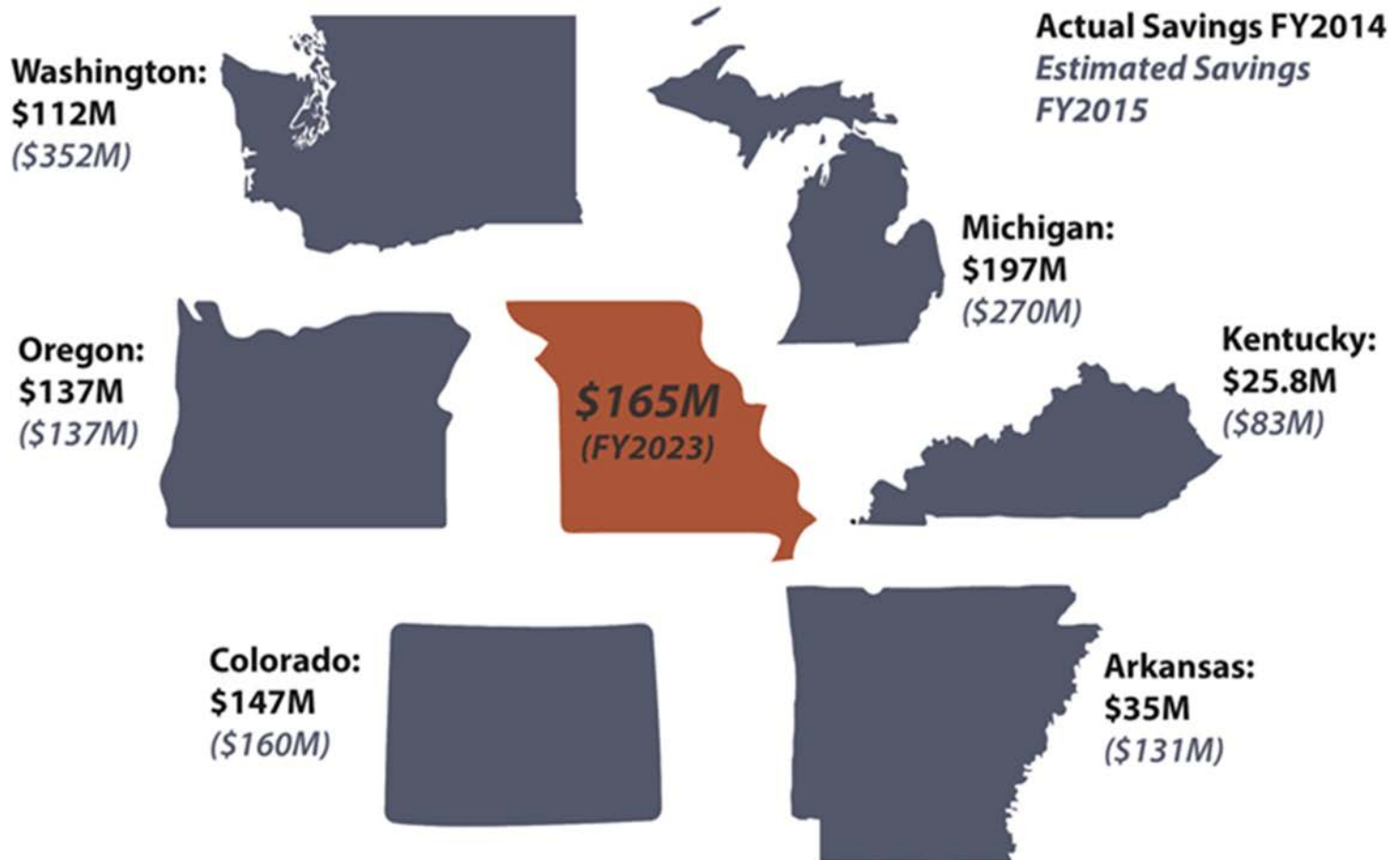

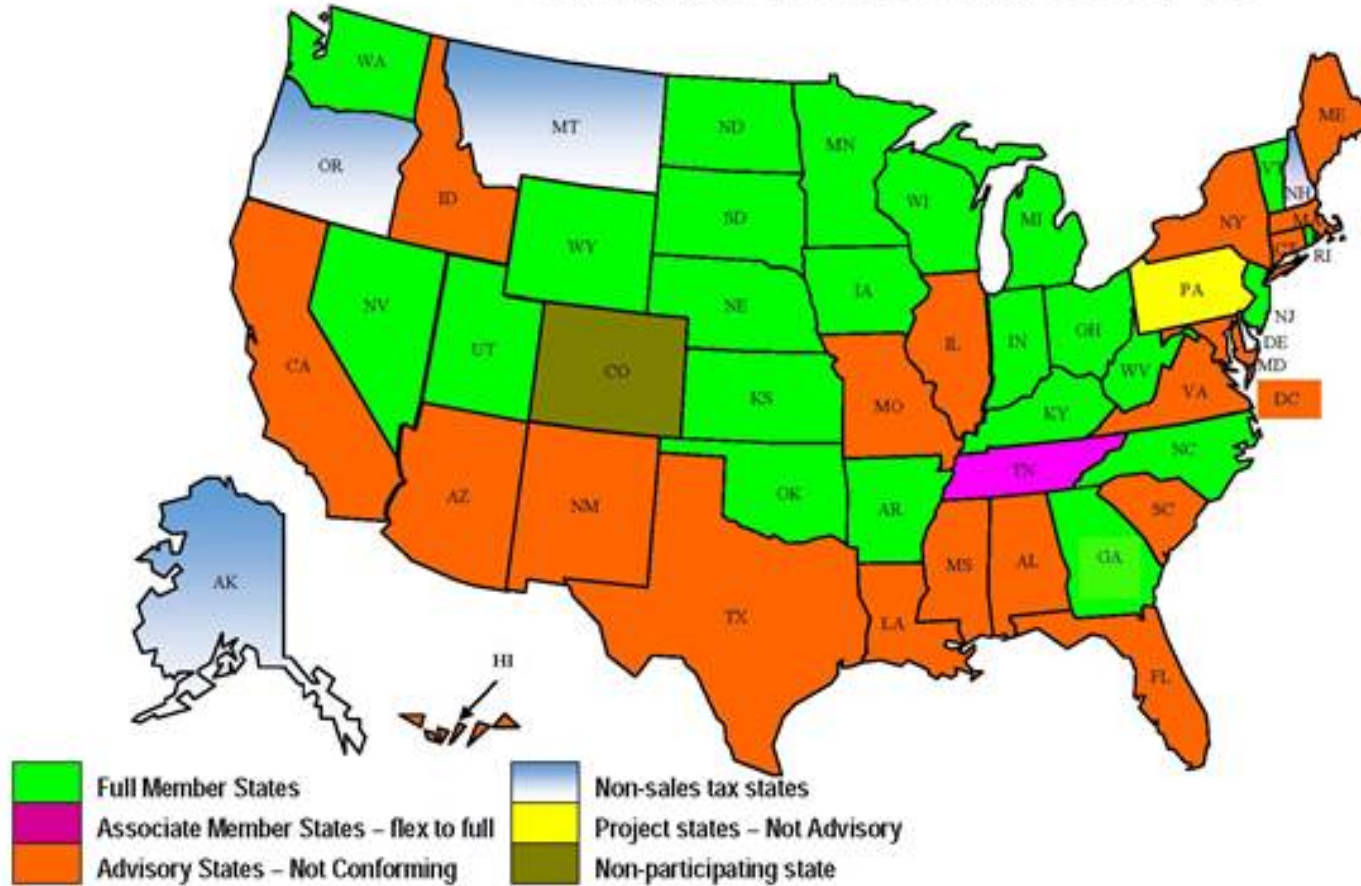
# Expand Medicaid Eligibility
