All	Discussion Regarding SMART Goals	<p>Drs. Jean Craig and Kathy Fuger discussed the most recent site visit from the U.S. Dept. of Health and Human Services, related to the Kansas City Healthy Start Initiative (KCHSI). They also explained the transition from the old Healthy Start model to the current model. This committee is expected to address the KCHSI benchmarks that are most relevant to its interests and act as a community action network. Those benchmarks relate to the following topics:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Intimate partner violence • Cigarette use • Perinatal depression • Father/partner involvement <p>The following suggestions were made as possible efforts of this committee:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Financial education for clients • Developing a more comprehensive list of resources who can actually accept new clients; it was noted that many services are overwhelmed and not accepting new clients • Education for clients regarding smoking during pregnancy • Refugee interventions-especially language and financial barriers • Transportation concerns of clients • Strengthen ties between KCHSI and programs/services that benefit clients – services need to be accessible • At some point in the future, invite various foundations to attend committee meetings to discuss possible resolutions to specific problems • Work on access to care concerns <p>It was suggested to use KCHSI metrics to compare other programs' work.</p> <p>The committee also discussed possible times for future meetings, as this current time does not work for Carol Ayres.
